A NOTE FROM THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Grand Strand Water and Sewer Authority (GSWSA) experienced remarkable growth during fiscal year 2024, aligning with Horry County's status as South Carolina's fastest-growing county for the past decade (U.S. Census Bureau). Continued residential and commercial development has solidified GSWSA's position to meet the expanding needs of communities across Horry, Georgetown, Marion, and Dillon Counties through strategic planning and fiscal discipline.

In 2024, GSWSA added a record 19,260 new customers, the largest annual increase in its history. Total assets grew by \$107.1 million, marking a 10.4% rise over the previous year. This growth, coupled with a commitment to quality service at affordable rates, has strengthened GSWSA's financial stability and its ability to support the region's dynamic economy.

Key investments included \$14.7 million for the Rural Water and Sewer Program, extending essential services to underserved communities in Horry County. Additionally, \$23.6 million was allocated for the acquisition of Little River Water and Sewerage Company, \$8.1 million for new water and sewer tap installations, and \$1 million for Water and Wastewater Renewal and Replacement projects.

GSWSA remains dedicated to delivering reliable, high-quality water and sewer services efficiently and effectively. Our focus on being a trusted community partner and providing exceptional customer service continues to guide our mission.

We are proud to present the 2024 Annual Report and grateful for the opportunity to serve our customers. On behalf of our staff and Board of Directors, thank you for your continued trust and support.

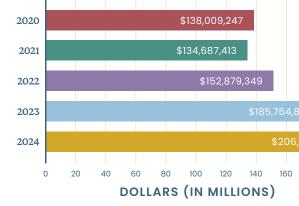

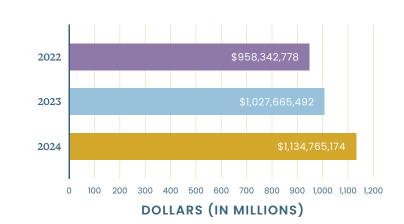

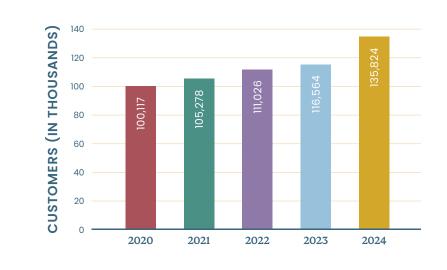
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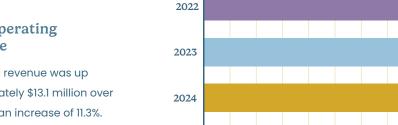




Total Assets, Liabilities, **Deferred Inflows and Outflows**

During FY 2024, total assets and deferred outflows increased by \$109.2 million and exceeded liabilities and deferred inflows by \$845.1 million.





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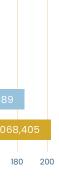
DOLLARS (IN MILLIONS)

Total Operating Revenue

Operating revenue was up approximately \$13.1 million over last year, an increase of 11.3%.

Total Revenue

Total revenue was up \$20.3 million over fiscal year 2023. This change is due to an increase in non-operating revenue as a result of an increase in investment income.



Total Assets

Total assets have increased 10.4% over the previous year.

Total Customers

During fiscal year 2024, GSWSA added 19,260 customers.

Typical Residential Bill

GSWSA rates are among the lowest in the region. A typical residential monthly water and sewer bill based on an average of 8,000 gallons in 2010 was \$41.10. In 2024, the same monthly bill was \$52.36, an average increase of 1.7% per year.
